- o Red types are task and result oriented, like recognition, like to be on the move, don't like to be late, enjoy individual sports, like expensive showy things, are generally honest, but their moral compass might deviate in a competitive show down.
- o Red types generally make good leaders; they love leadership roles and enjoy "managing" people (might be perceived as bossy by others)
- o Car of choice: something flashy and expensive, perhaps a sports car
- o If Red were an adult and had to put together a swing set: would pay someone else to do it for him/her

RED

- Green personality types are people oriented, expressive, friendly, love to talk, extravagant, optimistic, and usually enjoy team sports.
- Green types are the glue that hold groups together; they are typically outgoing and fun loving. They are the classroom talkers and like to “run in packs”.
- Car of choice: one that is large enough to hold their friends
- If Green were an adult and had to put together a swing set: would invite friends over to help build and barbeque

GREEN

- o Blue personality types are often creative, freethinking, sincere, loyal, caring, perceptive, understanding, open-minded, often enjoy nature and/or the arts.
- o Blue types are sometimes perceived as quiet, shy people. They may prefer to be alone or have one or two other “blue” friends. They are innovative, idea people. Because they tend to be quiet in a group, they should be called upon to share their great ideas.
- o Car of choice: Jeep, SUV, something ready for adventure
- o If Blue were an adult and had to put together a swing set: would probably design their own swing set

BLUE

- o Yellow personality types are usually detail oriented, precise, controlled, like to do things right the first time, like to complete jobs, typically thrifty as adults.
- o Yellow types like order; they generally have neat lockers and notebooks. Sometimes perceived as “neat freaks”. They make great treasures, secretaries or committee chairs in clubs/groups because they keep the group on track.
- o Car of choice: hybrid vehicle (energy efficient)
- o If Yellow were an adult and had to put a swing set together: would pull out all the directions, carefully arrange all the parts and pieces, then systematically build the swing set
